

Young Scientist Award for Socio- and Econophysics 2027



The German Physical Society announces the “Young Scientist Award for Socio- and Econophysics”, to be presented at the DPG Spring Meeting of the Condensed Matter Section (SKM) in Regensburg (March 14-19, 2027).

The Young Scientist Award for Socio- and Econophysics aims to promote the work of young researchers and to recognise outstanding scientific contributions that use methods derived from physics to achieve a better understanding of socio-economic problems. The prize, which is awarded annually, is aimed at young scientists who have not yet reached the age of 40 by the end of the submission period and is endowed with 7,500 EUR.

The Division of Socio-Economic Systems (SOE) is a division of the German Physical Society. Its goals are to promote research and coordinate activities on these topics in cooperation with comparable international professional societies, as well as to inspire young physicists for economic, social, and similarly interdisciplinary issues. The award ceremony will take place during the spring meeting of the Condensed Matter Section (SKM) of the DPG.

Eligible to nominate:

Scientists with a university degree are eligible to nominate (nominators are excluded from participation in the jury).

Nomination procedure:

The jury appointed by the Division of Physics of Socio-Economic Systems will identify a prize winner from among the nominees.
